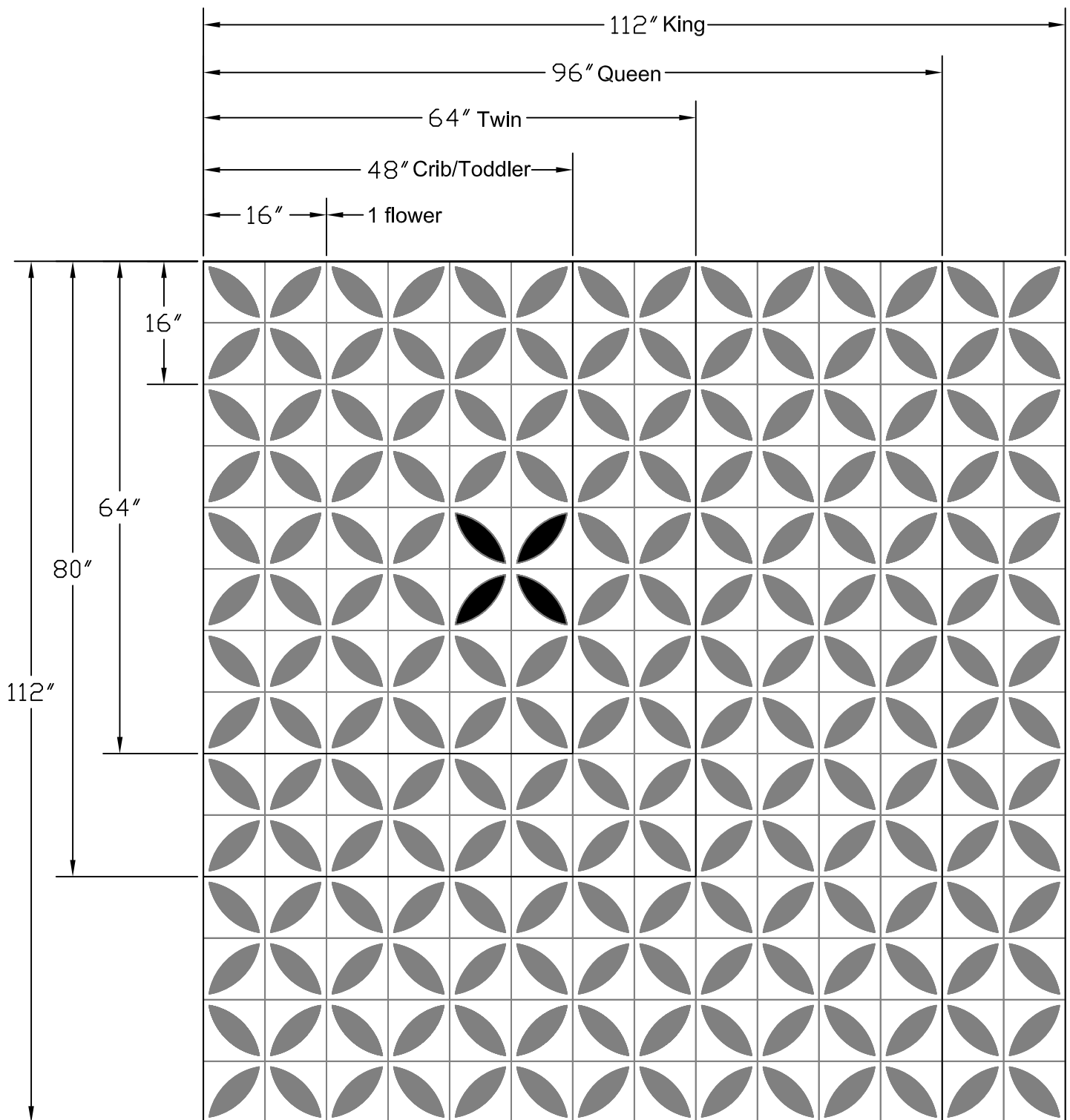


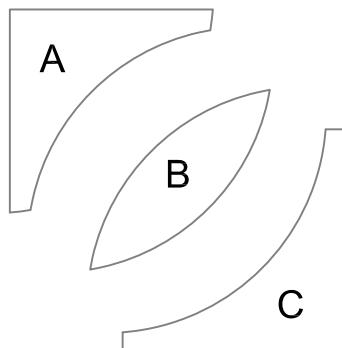

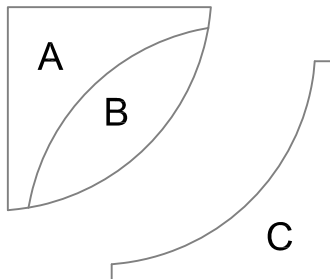


Idea Sheets

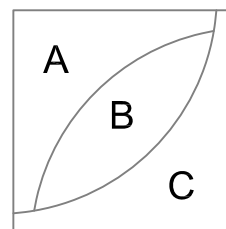
Start with 1 piece each of A,B, and C



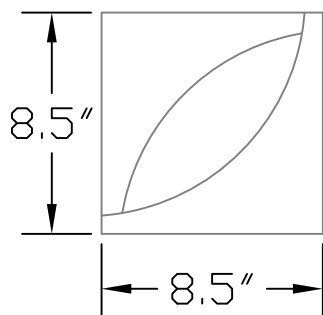
Sew B to A



Sew C to the AB unit



Now you have a block that is about 8.5" square



Square up and trim to get the look you want:

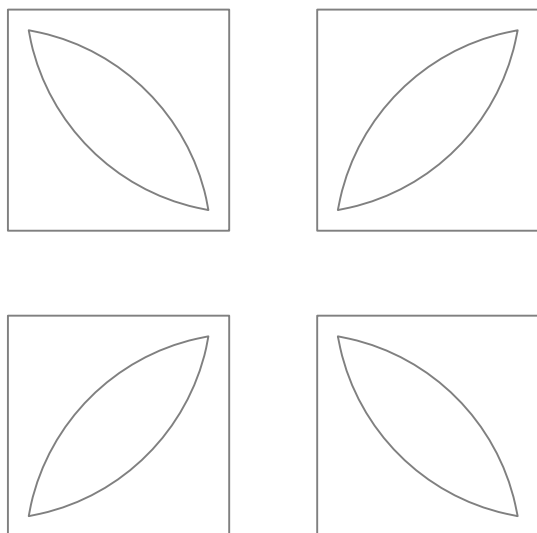
-trim to 1/4" away from the seed points to have your seeds just meet at the middle

-just square up your block to leave more space between the seeds

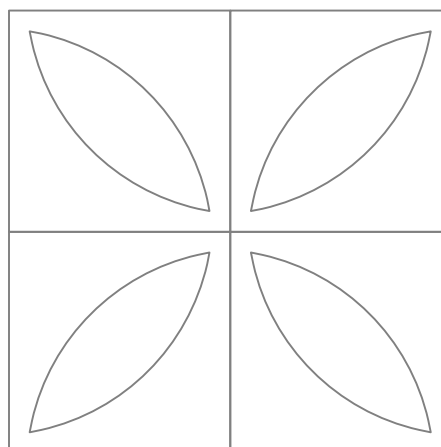
-trim anywhere in between to achieve the look you're going for

-Remember, this will affect the final size of your quilt. The sizes on the first page are based on an 8.5" block, finishing at 8" square.

Take 4 of your blocks and arrange them how you like

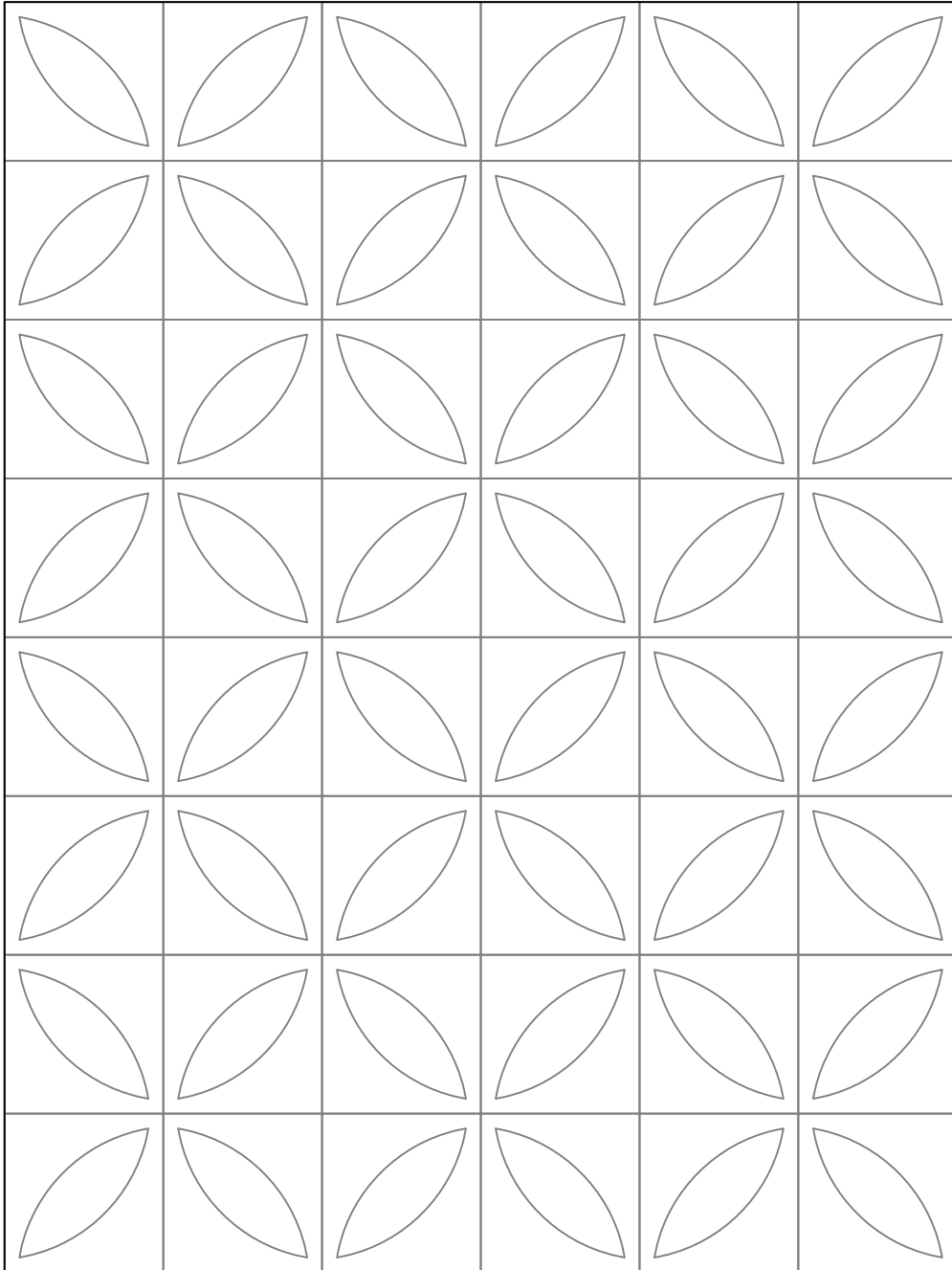


Sew the 4 blocks together to make a flower



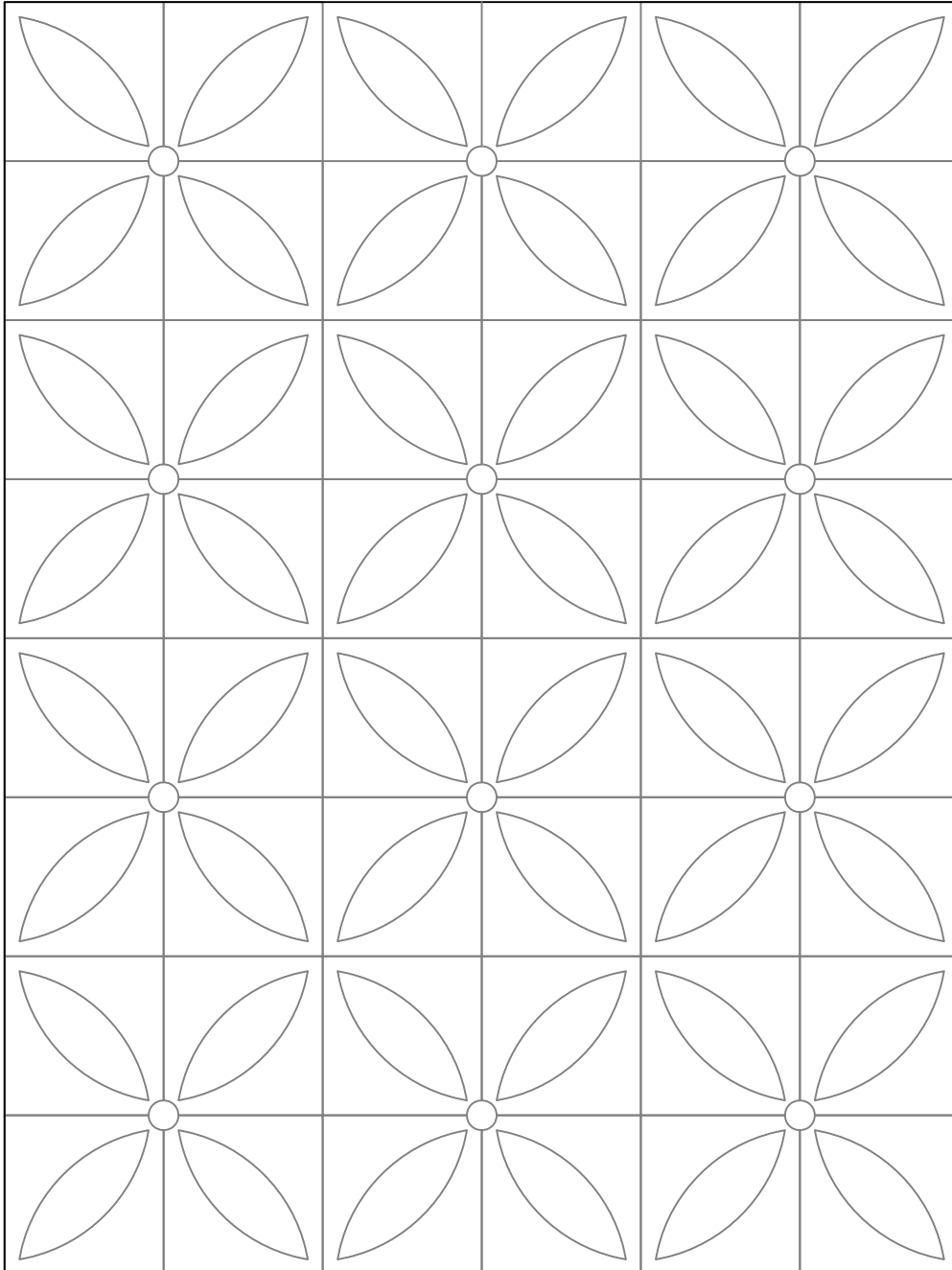

The Classic Orange Peel



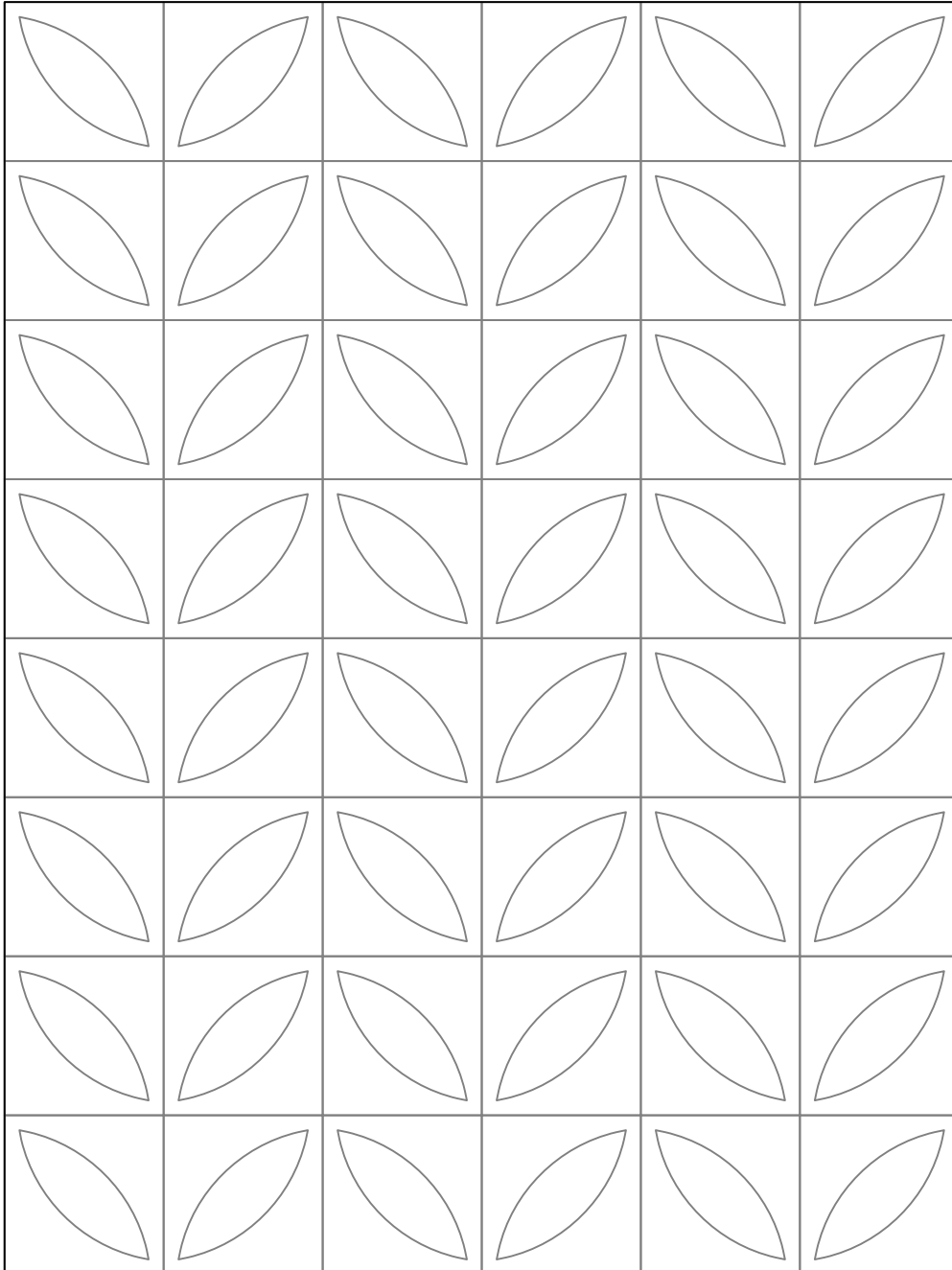

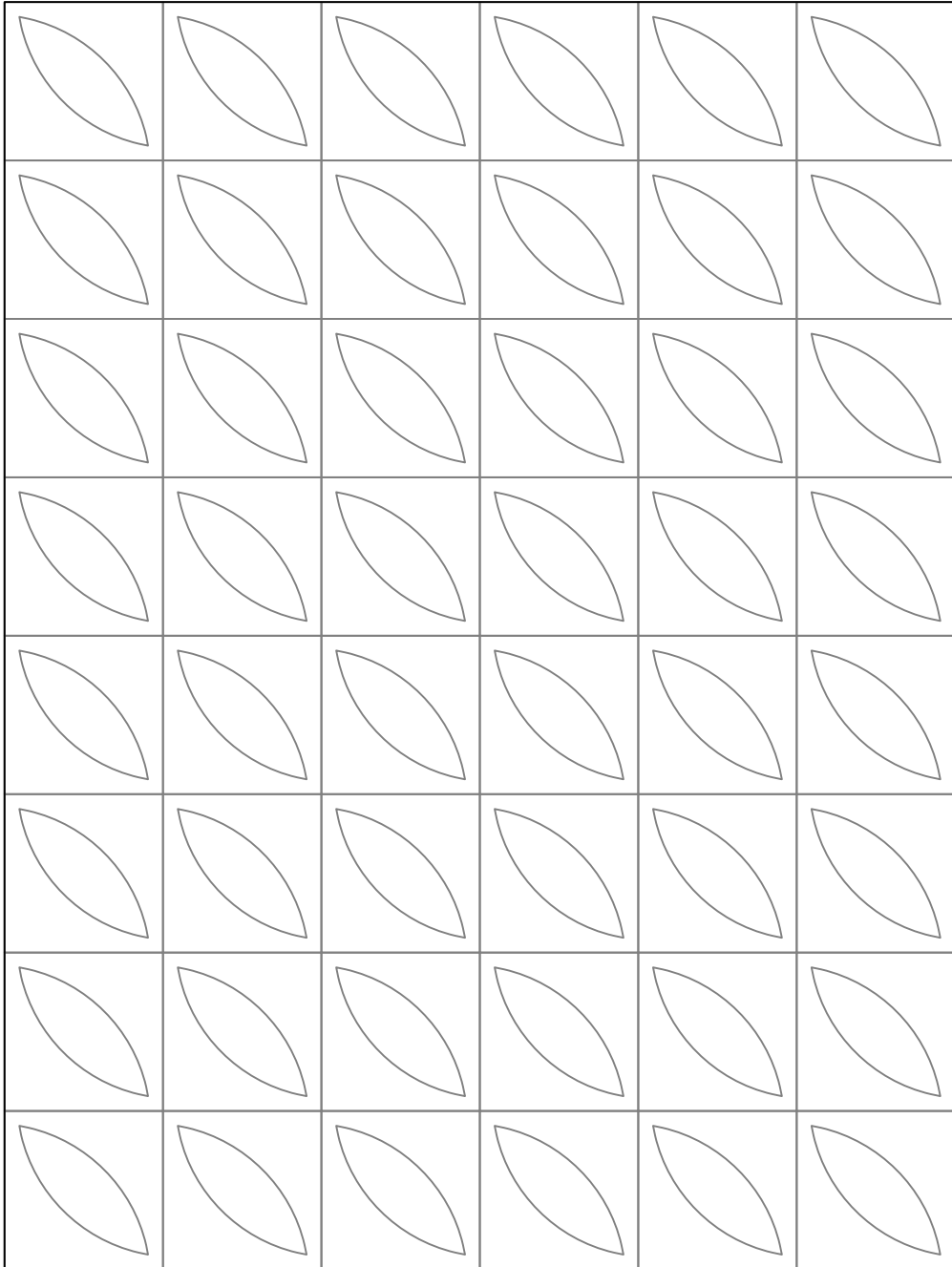

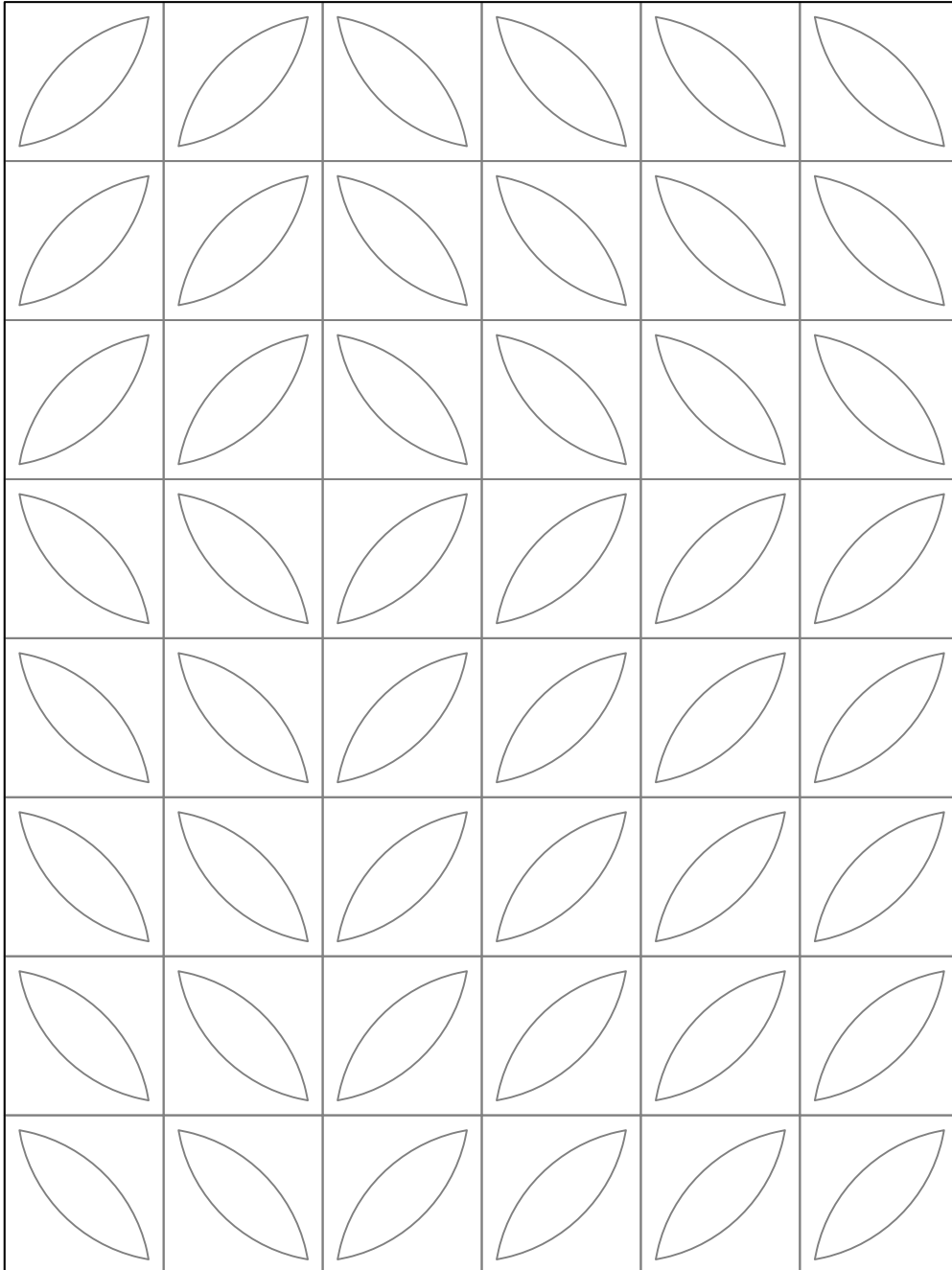
